Title: "Christ Superior to Angels"

Text: Hebrews 1:4 to 2:4 **Date:** Sunday, April 14, 2024 **Preacher:** Pastor Alain Alfonso

Introduction

Hebrews 1:4-14 in Various Translations:

- **ESV:** "Having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs..."
- **CSB:** "So he became as superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs."
- **NLT:** "This shows that the Son is far greater than the angels, just as the name God gave him is greater than their names."

Discussion Questions:

- 3. **Eternal Reign (Hebrews 1:8-12):** Discuss the significance of the quotes from Psalm 45:6-7 and Psalm 102:25-27 in demonstrating Jesus' eternal reign and unchanging nature. What do these psalms say about His kingship and divinity?
- 4. **Superiority Over Angels (Hebrews 1:13):** Consider the quote from Psalm 110:1 and its relevance to Hebrews 1:13. How does this psalm support the argument for Jesus' superiority over angels?

Application Questions:

- 1. **Reflecting on Sonship:** How can you personally respond to the teaching that Jesus is the Son of God, as highlighted in Psalm 2:7 and Hebrews 1:5, in your worship and prayers?
- 2. **Understanding Angels' Roles:** In light of Hebrews 1:7, which shows angels as servants, how can you model this servant role in your approach to community service or leadership?
- 3. Embracing Jesus' Eternal Nature: Considering Hebrews 1:10-12's emphasis on Jesus'

- unchanging and eternal nature, how can this assurance affect your response to life's uncertainties?
- 4. **Valuing Jesus Over All:** Hebrews 1:13-14 asserts Jesus' superiority over angels. How does this shape your understanding of spiritual hierarchy, and how might this influence your spiritual discussions or teaching?

 capability and willingness to save.
- We Are Saved at a Great Cost: The sacrifice of Christ, His suffering and death, mark the immense price paid for our redemption.
