Title: "Watch Out!"

Text: Hebrews 3:7-19

Date: Sunday, May 5, 2024

Preacher: Pastor Caleb Widmer

Last Week's Sermon Summary:

Last week's sermon, "Our Confidence and Hope," focused on Hebrews 3:1-6, where Pastor Caleb Widmer explored the theme of holding fast to our faith in Jesus as our Apostle and High Priest. The sermon emphasized Jesus' faithfulness and superiority over Moses, urging believers to remain steadfast in their confidence and hope in Him.

Introduction:

In this week's sermon, "Watch Out!" - Encouraging One Another:** Why is encouraging one another daily so crucial, according to **Hebrews 3:13**? How can this strengthen our faith and prevent unbelief?
- Persevering in Faith:** What does it mean to "hold our original confidence firm to the end" (**Hebrews 3:14**)? How does this relate to real faith and perseverance?

Application Questions:

- Self-Examination:** What practical steps can you take to examine your own heart (not those of others) regularly to avoid unbelief and maintain faithfulness?
- Daily Encouragement:** How can you be more intentional in encouraging others daily in your small group or church community?
- Holding Fast:** Reflecting on Hebrews 3:14, what challenges are you facing that require you to hold fast to your faith in Jesus? How can you remain steadfast?
- Trusting God's Presence:** How does Israel's story in Exodus 17:7 ("Is the Lord among us or not?") challenge you to trust God's presence and guidance in your own life?

Additional Biblical References:

- **Exodus 17:7:** The Israelites tested God at Massah and Meribah, doubting His presence and provision.
- **Numbers 14:26-30:** The consequences of Israel's unbelief, resulting in an entire generation not entering the Promised Land.
- **Proverbs 4:23:** "Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it."
- **Jeremiah 17:9:** "The heart is deceitful above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it?"
- **Psalm 95:7-11:** A call to worship and a warning not to harden our hearts like the Israelites.

Insights from Authors:
